Community Health Nurse - Full Time

The Malahat Nation is seeking a full time Community Health Nurse to join their Health Team. The Community Health Nurse role is a dual position which includes direct client care responsibilities related to Home and Community Care & Primary Health Care – Public Health Protection. This position combines administrative and direct client care responsibilities. Planning, supervision, coordination, communication, team building and strong nursing care competency are components of this role. The Community Health Nurse provides primary health care to community members across the lifespan and is based on an active partnership between the individual, their family and community supports and the nurse in decisions that affect their health and wellness. The focus is on primary health care and focus on promoting health, preventing disease and injury, protecting population health, as well as a focus on curative, urgent and emergent care, rehabilitation, and supportive or palliative care.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Applies and utilizes key nursing knowledge and critical thinking to choose options and to plan, implement, and evaluate programs and interventions to address health issues, taking into account relevant evidence, legislation, regulations, and policies.
- Involves individuals, families, groups, and communities as active partners to take action to address health inequities, and foster a self management care approach for chronic conditions.
- Participates in collaborative, interdisciplinary, and intersectoral partnerships to enhance the health of individuals, families, groups, and populations.
- Knows and conforms to the law governing the practice of professional nursing and provides professional nursing care using all elements of the nursing process.
- Assesses and evaluates the health care needs of community members and families with consideration regarding physiological, psychological, social and environmental factors.
- Develops a care plan based on community member needs, physician orders, nursing assessment parameters and identified goals that are respectful of client, family, and community and agency resources.
- Implements the care plan and revises it whenever necessary by regularly assessing, observing and evaluating the community member's condition, needs and response to care and makes appropriate nursing judgments and decisions for care plan revision.
- Initiates and applies appropriate preventative, therapeutic and rehabilitative nursing procedures and techniques.
- Administers medications and treatments as prescribed by a physician and performs nursing procedures and techniques.
- Administers vaccines and performs other treatments independently within scope of practice.
