QUALIFICATIONS AND EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor of Social Work, Psychology or degree
- Eligible to be registered by their respective professional bodies
- Three or more years' experience providing case management services
- A combination of education and extensive experience may be considered

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES / PREFERRED SKILLS

- Prior knowledge of Carrier/Sekani culture and socioeconomic conditions and working / engaging with Aboriginal peoples and Elders
- Possess superior individual, family and group counseling, and crisis intervention skills
- Ability to undertake case planning, assessment, treatment implementation, follow-up and case management in a team setting
- Ability to work independently and within a team setting
- Computer skills using Microsoft Office suite (MS Word, Excel)

WORKING/SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- Initial and on-going employment is subject to submission of a clear Criminal Record check. Criminal Record Check must be conducted every three years. CSFS reimburses this expense.
- Valid Class 5 B.C. Drivers License and reliable vehicle with required business insurance
- May be required to use own vehicle
- Exposure to regular travel to remote locations during all periods of the year
