This holistic approach applies to individuals, families and the community as a whole. As part of the wellness team and allied professionals within the Nation, the Mental Wellness Clinician will work collaboratively with community, staff and membership.

The Mental Wellness Clinician, in partnership with each community's health and wellness team, will provide holistic support through the context of Nation cultural values and beliefs for health, intellectual, emotional, physical, traditional, and spiritual well-being for clients and/or their families.

Overall, the Mental Wellness Clinician will serve clients/families in need of support with serious and persistent mental wellness concerns such as PTSD, complex trauma, depression, anxiety, and/or others. You will be required to work as part of a holistic inter-disciplinary team utilizing both western and traditional healing approaches and medicines.

Qualifications

The successful applicant must have knowledge of First Nations peoples, as well as, a good understanding of colonization and the unique history of Indigenous peoples in Canada. This understanding includes the impacts of colonization both past and present. The individual will practice from a trauma-informed and culturally safe paradigm. Flexibility in working hours and regular travel is a requirement of the position.

We are seeking a candidate with:

- Counselling experience working within a First Nations context;
- Masters' degree from an accredited university in an Allied Health, Behavioural, or Social Science field relevant to the position;
- Current membership in a recognized professional association is preferred;
- Five years' recent related experience in a mental health and substance use environment or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience;
- Group facilitation experience in both traditional First Nations approaches and mainstream approaches;
- General competency in concurrent disorders;
- Excellent communication skills and cross cultural communication experience;
