

Lu'Ma medical clinic will be a brand new facility at Nanaimo and Grandview. The Lu'Ma medical clinic will sit adjacent to the Lu'Ma Native Housing Society – a development to help ensure a continued supply of adequate housing at a modest cost to Aboriginal people with low and moderate incomes. The independent but ancillary medical clinic will harbor similar goals related to healthcare and improved health outcomes for the surrounding Aboriginal as well as non-Aboriginal community.

Lu'Ma is currently looking for a physician(s) interested in building a new flagship clinic that can serve as a model for additional sites that will blend modern fee for service medicine with traditional Aboriginal healing and hopefully integrate the services of other allied health professionals as a long term goal. Potential physicians would have the freedom to build their own patient panels as well as subsidize their income and support the community by seeing walk in traffic as well – at least in the early stages of the clinic.

Lu'Ma is looking for physicians of all cultural background but will give preference to any physicians with Aboriginal heritage. While there is a large Aboriginal community in proximity to the clinics location, Lu'Ma will be designed to serve patients of all ethnic origins.

Lu'Ma is scheduled to open in the early spring of 2016 and would like to chat with any interested candidates for a permanent role there. They will offer competitive revenue splits, a state of the art new facility and the opportunity to be part of something new, exciting and beneficial to Vancouver and the Aboriginal community.
