- Completion of a Masters in Social Work or equivalent degree i.e. Masters in counselling or psychology.
- At least three (3) years of direct counselling experience (short-term counselling) working with individuals and families with mild to moderate mental health challenges and substance abuse
- Demonstrated experience working with concurrent disorders
- Must be a member in good standing with a regulated health college as per current standards for practicing social work, counselling, and/or psychotherapy
- Demonstrated knowledge of risk factors and risk assessment
- Demonstrated knowledge of resources and services available to clients
- Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of the culture, history and current oppressions experienced by people related to mental health and substance abuse challenges
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Demonstrated skills in analysis of individuals and systemic issues impacting clients
- Strong organizational and planning skills
