Home Care Nurse

Reporting to: The Home Care Nurse reports directly to the Toosey Band_Health Director and Stone Band Manager

Position Summary: Working within the context of the culturally safe, client-centered, family focused vision and goals of the Toosey and Stone Band Health_Home and Community Care Program, and in accordance with College of Registered Nurses of British Columbia (CRNBC) Standards of Practice, the Home Care Nurse combines her/his health sciences knowledge with assessment, supervisory and clinical nursing skills to effectively assess and coordinate client care for the Toosey and Stone Band Home and Continuing Care Program. The Home Care Nurse provides direction, guidance and supervision of the Home Support Workers.

Hours for this position are one day per week for Toosey Indian Band, and two days per week for Stone, for a total of three days per week.

- Seeks guidance from First Nations leadership in order to validate and integrate First Nations knowledge into all aspects of health and well-being
- Works respectfully with clients and health department staff in a culturally safe, relational and inclusive manner
- Knowledge of local community resources and agencies
- Ability to work both within a team and independently
- Computer skills and willingness to learn new programming as appropriate
- Ability to guide and supervise Home Support Workers and the ability to establish realistic performance expectations
- Self-directed with demonstrated organizational skills
