# First Nations Health Authority and Canadian Red Cross Announce Partnership for Disaster Response

**VICTORIA, BC – May 13, 2020** — The First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) and the Canadian Red Cross have a long-standing partnership, expanding to include collaboration for the 'Ready When the Time Comes' program. Under this agreement, the FNHA will provide up to 30 employees when required as surge capacity to the Red Cross for disaster response in British Columbia, beginning in June 2020.

### About the 'Ready When the Time Comes' Program

The 'Ready When the Time Comes' program enables the Red Cross to utilize valuable human resources from its partner organizations to create community-based volunteer teams, which can be mobilized during natural disasters, such as floods or wildfires. Through this partnership, organizations like the FNHA provide an opportunity for their employees to assist the Red Cross in case of a domestic emergency. FNHA permanent employees will have the opportunity to take a paid volunteer leave to support Red Cross operations in British Columbia. FNHA volunteers will:

- Receive approximately 12 hours of emergency response training from the Canadian Red Cross including psychological first aid training.
- Serve a minimum of seven (7) days in a disaster response deployment, in the role of Emergency Responder.
- Work six days per week for up to 12 hours per day during disaster response.
- Receive additional training to ensure services are delivered safely within the context of COVID-19.
