2022 International Overdose Awareness Day Community Grants – Application Form

Grants of up to \$2,000 are available for First Nations communities and health and social service, non-profit organizations providing harm reduction services to Indigenous people in BC. **Please ensure your application is complete.** Incomplete applications may create delays in processing, so please review your application to ensure you have provided all of the required information. When possible, it is preferred that the FNHA receives applications online (<u>FNHA IOAD 2022 Grant online application form</u>).

Criteria

Please review the following criteria before submitting an application for the 2022 International Overdose Awareness Day (IOAD) Community Grants

- The grants are intended to support in-person and/or virtual initiatives that encourage First Nations in BC to honor loved ones lost to the toxic drug and overdose crisis with an acknowledgement event on or around IOAD on August 31st;
- 2. Activities must be conducted through methods that ensure safety, are in alignment with Orders of the Provincial Health Officer (e.g., virtual gatherings, webinars), and in partnership with First Nations leaders and health workers in the field of harm reduction and overdose response;
- 3. Eligible recipients include First Nations communities, and health and social, non-profit organizations that provide wellness and harm reduction services to Indigenous people in BC, inclusive of correctional facilities. Single grants of up to \$2,000 are available to eligible recipients. Completion of a brief closing report will be required to capture the highlights of your initiative.
- 4. Applicants must demonstrate meaningful and culturally-safe partnership with First Nations communities when applying for these funds. Recipients are encouraged to collaborate with neighboring communities and Indigenous organizations where feasible i.e., if communities of the same Nation apply for separate grants but collaborate together to collectively host a larger event.
