Salary

Up to Bachelors: \$19.87 - \$21.11 - \$22.35 / hour

Masters: \$24.82 - \$26.98 - \$29.43 / hour

The Salary Range is the minimum and maximum hourly salary. Incumbents are typically hired, transferred or promoted within the range based on their level of education and experience in relation to the role requirements.

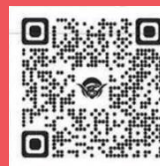
