# **Urban and Away-from-Home Engagement**



The First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) is engaging with the urban and away-from-home population (UAH), BC First Nations, urban Indigenous organizations and health system partners in each region.

**Urban and Away from Home** includes status and non-status First Nations people in BC who live in:

- a city, urban, rural, remote or isolated area that is not in a First Nations community or on a reserve
- a reserve that is away from their home community



#### Who do we want to hear from?

The First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) wants to hear from the **UAH population**, staff from **BC First Nations** (health, social or political leads), **urban Indigenous organizations** and **health system partners** in each region ("partners").

#### What is our goal?

The FNHA wants to engage with the UAH population to develop an **UAH Engagement Framework** to understand how to better communicate and involve the UAH population in decision making regarding their health and wellness and a **UAH Health and Wellness Service Needs Report** that highlights the health and wellness service needs of the UAH population and will be used to support advocacy for the UAH population across the province.

## Where will engagement take place? \_

Engagement will take place throughout the province in-person and virtually. An online engagement survey is available for those who are unable to attend in-person and virtual sessions on our <u>main</u> <u>webpage</u> (www.fnha.ca/uah). Engagement will also take place at larger provincial events and conferences through workshops and information booths.

### When will engagement take place? -

Engagement began in March 2023, with in-person sessions in the Northern region and will continue throughout the province until Spring/Summer 2025.
