Statistical Summary

Over 1000 different clients access support through the MOUHSS during October 2021 to December 2022. Ongoing or regular supports at 639 different people. Many folks from North Island pass through to utilize MOUHSS during this time. Over 52 vulnerable people engaged in Get The Point and SOS programs.

4 people were referred to the RV via emergency room: Ex: person came to RV for subsequent blood draw or follow up instead of returning to emergency room.
