Currently serves as Southcentral Foundation's director of traditional healing and tribal relations, as well as an advisor on Alaska Native and American Indian issues among the National Institutes of Health.

As an Inupiat Eskimo enrolled in the Village of Buckland as well as the Northwest Arctic Native Association (NANA) in Kotzebue, he integrates his indigenous values with his Russian heritage to assist other Native people in "walking in two worlds with one spirit". He lectures on circumpolar medicine as well as the role of indigenous people in health research. His father was Ray Mala, the first Alaska Native or American Indian film star whose credits included the Oscar winning film "Eskimo" (1932).
