RE: Information on Community Naloxone Program for RN non-Certified Practice Implementation – BC CDC Opioid Overdose Prevention Program

Key points for RN Community Health Nurses (CHN) on RN Non-Certified *Opioid Overdose Prevention – Take Home Naloxone*

Purpose: To provide information supporting the sustained implementation of culturally safe, comprehensive systems of opioid overdose prevention to all First Nations persons including socially and medically appropriate methods of self-determined overdose reversal.

Assessment:

- 1. CHN Readiness
 - a. Assess own readiness to administer naloxone for the purpose of opioid overdose reversal
 - b. Assess own readiness to train community members & coworkers on naloxone opioid reversal
- 2. Community Readiness
 - a. Rationale in community: any person who uses opioids is at risk of experiencing an overdose
 - In concert with Health Director, provide background on addictions/opioid pharmacology to health department staff & other stakeholders such as RCMP, first responders, council members, health service or addictions partners
